- **Bild.de**, online tabloid publication; the advantage of the site is that it immediately translates the German word into English
- Plenty of **'teenage' literature'**, e.g. 'Famous Five', 'Hanni und Nanni' on the bookshelves in B12
- **'Harry Potter'** in German in the library
- **German classics** such as Goethe, Frisch etc. on the bookshelves in B12 for a more demanding read

- **LISTENING**
